SO WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

An apprenticeship is a training programme designed to let you work for a real employer and earn a real salary whilst gaining absolutely invaluable workplace skills and experience working alongside experienced staff.

All apprentices work towards a nationally-recognised industry qualification as part of their training programme and you will study for this on day release at college (usually one day per week). You may have had enough of school-based studying and just want to get out into the world and start earning some money.

Or, you may already be working but looking to try something new or improve your skills to help you progress up the career ladder.

And, whether you're looking for your first role or are already in employment an apprenticeship can give you the chance to do just that.

SO WHAT BENEFITS WOULD I GET AS AN APPRENTICE?

- Earn a salary
- Learn the very latest skills relevant to your job
- Get paid holidays
- Gain a nationally-recognised qualification

DID YOU KNOW:

- After finishing, over 90% of apprentices stay in employment
- Nearly a ¼ of former apprentices had been promoted within 12 months of finishing
- 89% of apprentices are satisfied with their apprenticeship
- On average a successful advanced apprentice can expect to earn from £77,000 to £117,000 more, over a lifetime, than a similar individual with a Level 2 qualification
- Those completing a higher apprenticeship could see increased earnings of around £150,000 over their lifetime
- Nearly 20% of advanced apprentices progress to higher education – at college or university – over time following their apprenticeship
- Apprenticeships are available to everyone over the age of 16 who is not in full-time education
- Apprenticeships are available to school leavers and those already in employment
- Apprenticeships are available for intermediate (Level 2) through to degree-level (Levels 6 and 7)

SO HOW DO I BECOME AN APPRENTICE?

Do you know what area of work particularly interests you? What do you enjoy and why? Where do you see your career path taking you?

To become an apprentice, you need to be able to demonstrate that you have the potential, motivation, drive and commitment needed to work towards – and achieve – the high quality skills demanded by business and industry.

But don't be fooled into thinking an apprenticeship is an easy option. Apprenticeships can be very demanding but also very rewarding.

HOW DO I APPLY?

1. Have a look through the Apprenticeship Course pages in this guide and see which area appeals to you. You could always pop along to one of our open events in October, November, February or June to have a chat with our apprenticeship team about the apprenticeships we offer.
2. Once you've decided on the area in which you would like to follow an apprenticeship, visit our dedicated apprenticeship pages on the website www.weymouth.ac.uk and see which specific apprenticeship you would like to apply for.
3. Apply online – either at home or in college if you need help or support.
4. You will be invited in for an interview with the apprenticeship team.
5. We will match you with your apprenticeship course and employer.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry requirements will vary dependent upon the level you wish to start your apprenticeship. All apprentices need to be 16 years of age or older.
